Not-for-Profit and Charitable organizations incorporated under the Corporations Act (Ontario) were given until October 18, 2024, to bring their letters patent and by-laws into compliance with ONCA.

HHS is completing their own ONCA work and their lawyers are offering us their help with this.

Volunteer Coordinator Report May 2024

2024 Annual General Meeting

Many volunteer organizations have struggled to climb back to their pre-pandemic status and our Auxiliary is no different. However, we have made great strides this past year. When we ended 2022, we had a total of 7,700 volunteer hours, and as of Dec 2023, we had a total of 14,200 hours. Still a long way from our pre-pandemic total in 2019 of 26,000 hours, but we had about 150 active volunteers then, whereas we have about 100 volunteers currently onsite. With the completion of the new hospital a year from now and hopefully additional parking space for volunteers soon afterwards, we can expect to recruit many more volunteers into not only existing, but new placement areas, with shifts extending into the weekends and evenings.

The AGM was held on April 18th and as Volunteer Coordinator, I had the pleasure of presenting the service awards to many amazing volunteers who play a vital role in our community hospital. As you'll see in this newsletter, awards were given to 15 volunteers to recognize their Hours of Service, from 500 hours to 12,000 hours. Also, we recognized two volunteers, Barb McDermid and Sheila Scott, who achieved over 25 years of committed service to the Auxiliary! For the Outstanding Service awards, we celebrated three volunteers, Barb Jackson, Jillian Harshaw and Marlene Morais. This award is for those who go above and beyond, working on fundraising events, providing exemplary service and a minimum of 5 years membership. And lastly, one Life Member award was presented to Fred Lilley, a two-time Auxiliary President, who has served in a leadership capacity at the Board or Committee for at least 10 years (2 terms as President!) and has exhibited continued dedication and service to the Auxiliary.

To all of our volunteers, I want to say that we are grateful for your willingness to give your time, energy, and talents. Your support of West Lincoln Memorial Auxiliary allows us to continue fulfilling our mission and serve the people in our community, as we have done for the past 80 years.

Volunteers in the ED

Volunteers have returned after more than ten years to the Emergency Department (ED) waiting room. Seven days a week, they provide support to staff, patients and visitors in the ED, greeting patients upon arrival in the ED; providing wayfinding assistance to visitors/patients; answering basic questions for visitors/patients; and completing various tasks to support the ED staff.

The ED schedule is currently supported by 10 dedicated volunteers, including 4 university students who fill the weekend shifts. We currently have two weekday shifts still open and are in need of additional volunteers to spare when others are away. Early records focused on tasks performed for the hospital including sewing (towels, bedsheets, hospital gowns, etc.) and activities like canning fruit vs. volunteer hours contributed.

As we celebrate our 80th anniversary it is a good time to reflect on our more recent contributions to the Hospital and the community.

WLMA is a 100% Volunteer organization.

Hours donated also include those contributed by the Fundraising Committee and those accumulated by Committee Heads and our Executive as they manage the administration and planning of volunteer activities.

Our ability to support WLMH was greatly impacted by Covid. Active membership fell from 158 in 2019 to 107 in 2024.

In March of 2020, all volunteer activities ceased. We reopened the Coffee Shop and Gift Shop briefly in the Fall only to close 8 weeks later due to rising Covid cases at the Hospital (during this time contactless payment was introduced).

During 2021 all outlets and fundraising remained closed. Monthly Executive meetings, ongoing discussions about Covid with the WLMH Site Director and Redevelopment meetings for new WLMH all became virtual.

Reintegrations training commenced in May 2022 and the Gift Shop and Coffee Shop re-opened in June much to the delight of our Volunteers!

Annual Volunteer hours were consistently between 20,000 to 30,000 in the decade prior to the pandemic shutdown that happened in March 2020. Happily, we have seen the hours bounce back in the past 2 years:

2019 - 27,703

2020 - 5,264

2021 - 1052

2022 - 7,738

2023 - 14,153 hours

Total Volunteers hours from 2008-2023 - 515,186!


